Crossan Quote of the Week:

Explaining why John the Baptist's movement was unsuccessful while Jesus' movement worked: "John the Baptist had a monopoly. Jesus had a franchise..."

Last Sunday, one of our choir members heard an interesting reason for not coming to the John Dominic Crossan lectures: "I'm not a deep theological thinker."

Please be assured that Dom's lectures won't require deep theological thought. (They might require deep appreciation of Irish humour!) Dom's starting point is always history. He explains how societies evolve to favour the rich and powerful while oppressing the poor and weak. He explains how this played out in the Jewish homeland under Roman rule. He shares a strong belief that the ministries of Jesus, Paul and the early church were all a response to Roman oppression and violence—the same kind of oppression and violence that continues today. The only difference is that the Caesars of Rome have been replaced by the Caesars of big corporations and big governments. All this and more...

Hardly any of this is about theology. It's about describing how things were and how things are and how Christians ought to respond. It's not about what to believe but what to do next. Did you know?...

Wesley Knox depends on charitable givings to provide the services and programs that benefit us all. Fortunately, Canada's tax system provides generous incentives to encourage Canadians to donate to charities in the form of tax credits for charitable givings.

For example, the first \$200 of donations for the year gives you a tax credit of about 25%. In other words, when you give \$200 to Wesley-Knox, it's really only costing you \$150 after you file your tax returns.

If you give \$500, you will get a much larger tax credit on the next \$300. All donations above \$200 give you a tax credit of about 46%. That additional \$300 will only cost you about \$162.

And remember - Wesley Knox issues official charitable receipts for donations of \$20 or more to enable you to reduce your taxes through these tax credits.

Thank you for your ongoing support of Wesley-Knox - both financially and with your time and talents.
