Crossan Quote of the Week: Jesus called for nonviolent resistance and a just distribution of land and food. He was crucified because he threatened Roman stability, not as a sacrifice to God for humanity's sins.

We hope you are planning to come to our **John Dominic Crossan** lecture series. Dom has spent a lifetime studying Jesus, Jesus' ministry and the early Christian movement. Lately, he has turned his attention to violence, particularly violence in the Bible. Among his conclusions: Jesus believed in a non-violent God. Jesus' ministry was less about personal salvation than about creating a kinder, saner world. And the early Christian movement was largely a protest against an oppressive Roman Empire. He finds many parallels today. Now as back in the first century, what will it be? A world of violence, force and oppression or a world of non-violence, justice and peace? These lectures will challenge you. But we are sure of several things. After hearing Dom, you will hear the words of the Bible a bit differently. You will hear the words of Jesus and Paul a bit differently. And you will become more secure in your faith, the faith that sustains us all.
